Mills claims he was part of a team that did the first and only ground rescue in Afghanistan. He claims he rescued an American Family born and raised in Texas.

The mother was a Afghan Refugee who returned for a 30 day vacation to visit her family out side Kabul.

Mills never set foot in Afghanistan in September 2021. He would have had to obtain a Special Visa to cross the bridge.

The Afghani refugee (Mariam Mohammad Rahim) and her 3 kids got the help of local Afghanis and the Taliban to transport her from Kabul to the border town bridge (IT WAS NOT MILLS).

When the family got to the Takjistan Border, border guards would not let them past thru the gate over the bridge because they did not have visas to enter into Takjistan.

Glenn Devitt's Sentinel Foundation Team (NOT MILLS TEAM) Matt Murphy, Tim Zaj and Yusaf tricked the Taliban into opening the gate to let the Afghani refugee and her three kids cross the bridge.

Tim Zaj and Zusaf used their Yusaf Sat phone to trick the Taliban by convincing the Taliban that they were on orders from Qatar.

The border guards contacted the U.S. Embassy in Takjistan and the U.S. Embassy arranged special tourist visas for them to come thru the country in order to get a flight out to Qatar.

Mills says he lost contact with "his team: and had took a taxis to theplace for his photo ops you see in news articles and on his campaign site.

NOTE that the Sentinel Foundation stayed and helped get over 28 people out that way and HAD NOTHING TO DO WITH MILLS.

Mills first story – but see the facts that contradict it

Businessman and U.S. Army Combat Veteran Cory Mills, who just flew back to the U.S. after a harrowing rescue mission into Kabul, Afghanistan, is accusing the Biden administration of "covering up" the deaths of American citizens after the suicide attack that killed 13 U.S.

service members.

Mills flew into Afghanistan to exfiltrate four American citizens left stranded in Kabul.

During a phone call with The Floridian after his return from Afghanistan, Mills, a former Army Special Operations Command Ranger, said that he and his team were in contact with at least one other American family who was waiting just outside the Abbey Gate entrance to the airport when the blast occurred.

That American family consisted of a woman, her two-year-old daughter, and her father.

Mills said that after the blast, they never heard back from the woman, leading to believe that she and her family were "parished" in the attack. "I can tell you that she was not the only American out at that gate. This idea that there were only 160 Afghans that died and thirteen American service members that died. No, there were Americans on the other side of that gate that died in that explosion," said Mills. They are covering it up." Mills told his story of having his flight be refused landing rights when all of his paperwork was in order, even saying that the U.S. military had an F-16 fighter jet "fly over the top of our aircraft" to prevent them from landing in Kabul.

The team was threatened that if they landed, the aircraft they were flying would be taken away.

Mills is currently running for the U.S. Congress in Florida's 7th congressional district. As of right now, Mills will face off against Conservative State Rep. Anthony Sabatini (R) in the 2022 primary election.

Rep. Sabatini recently garnered the endorsement of Sen. Rand Paul (R). Mills has also landed some endorsements, wrangling the support of U.S. Reps. Brian Mast, John Rutherford, Mark Wayne Mullin, Brian Babin, Greg Steube, Ronny Jackson, Jim Banks, and Neal Dunn.

Representatives voted 407-16 to pass the ALLIES Act, a bill that would improve and provide visas for Afghan interpreters who worked for American personnel during the war. [130][131] The initiative aimed to bring in Afghans under a Special Immigrant Visa (SIV), which would allow them to bring their families and establish work in the United States. The SIV program was first created in 2006 by Congress, for Iraq and Afghan interpreters, with an estimated 50,000 or more individuals qualifying for the program. [citation needed] The first flight of the program arrived on 30 July 2021, with individuals who had qualified for the SIV and family members. While the majority of arrivals were to be relocated either to the United States, US facilities abroad or other countries to finish out the visa applications, the first group were to complete their visa applications at Fort Lee, Virginia, due to prior background checks and security screening. On 26 August, there was a suicide bombing at Hamid Karzai International Airport, killing 11 Marines, one Army paratrooper, one Navy Corpsman and 170 Afghan citizens.

This was the day and spot that the woman was at on same day and Sentinel Foundation was flying over Kabul in a rented plane.

Amarillo woman rescued from Afghanistan shares her experience

AMARILLO, Texas (KAMR/KCIT) — After weeks of trying to leave Afghanistan, an Amarillo woman and her three children are back home safely, returning last Friday.

With some help from a member of Congress and an ex-contractor and his team, U.S. citizen Mariam Rahim and her family were among the first Americans to escape Afghanistan after August 31. Rahim said she and her three children were visiting Afghanistan when the Taliban took over. "My family is over there. my parents, my dad was sick, you know, wanted to visit him. and after 20 days, we tried to early come back home," Rahim said. "We were looking for the tickets, the tickets were, you know, sold out, all of them everything. So before that everything happened, you know, we tried to come back home."

She said they went to Kabul to try to get a flight home.

"We still needed some help from State Department, you know. We get call, phone call, phone call, and they told us we go to the airport and the gate, you know, 'Just show your passport, they let you go in,' and we stay like 16 hours. We stay like every night, like eight hours, nine hours, and nobody's helping us." Her husband asked U.S. Rep. Ronny Jackson (R-TX 13) for help.

This is one version of the story from Rep Jackson that he heard from Mills. Congressman Mullin is on video going into more detail on the story.

"Her husband, who is here still in Amarillo, was obviously worried about his wife and his children, and they they couldn't get out, you know, as soon as the Taliban took over Kabul," Rep. Jackson said. "And this is before the bombing, days and days before that, you know. This is right after Kabul had fallen and the Taliban had taken over Kabul and it was obvious that the Americans, you know, were going to have a lot of trouble getting out." He said they immediately reached out to the State Department. "We gave them all the information we had, copies of the passports, we had everything that we could possibly find, got it to the state department. and we got no results, nothing." With increasing danger, Rep. Jackson called Cory Mills, his friend and a former contractor. He and his team gathered resources and planned to make a rescue in Kabul. They aimed to go into the city, save the Rahim family, and several Special Immigrant Visa holders.

"They literally had an aircraft that was circling the airfield and they were told by the State Department and by the U.S. Military, they could not land the aircraft," he said.

While the congressman's D.C. office worked to try to help, Mariam and her family continued to try to leave from the Kabul airport. "I showed the Taliban the passport, you know, they told me, 'If nobody called your name from inside the airport, we don't let you go in,' the first time. And the second time I go ask him the same thing, 'Brother, I will speak Pashto, you know. how he can help me so I can go in?' They say, 'We can't you know, we can't? do you understand me or not?' and they pull the guns and put it to my head. So, you know, that's two times they did to me," Mariam Rahid said.

Rep. Jackson said his offices continued to work on their behalf, saying, "The next day, the Americans just, in the middle of the night, just pulled out of the airport, just left Kabul and abandoned Kabul all together."

He continued, "At that point, we got word that the Taliban were already going around in Miriam's neighborhood looking for her and her family. They knew she was an American citizen. They were asking neighbors and stuff where they're at." Mills and his team were able to take her family to a safe house 13 hours away in Mazar-i-Sharif. (The "team" were Afghanis NOT MILLS

"At that point that there were six planes on the ground, fueled, had crews ready to go, the manifests were put together." But, he said the Taliban would not let the flights leave. They were holding the family as ransom for the U.S. to recognize them as the government of Afghanistan. So, Mills' team took them to the border of another country for safety. (The "team" were Afghanis NOT MILLS

There, he said the U.S. Embassy finally helped them get tourist visas to enter the country. "So, that's what the embassy started working on right away and they helped us with that part of it

but they had nothing to do with them crossing," he said. "They let Mariam and her family across and then we were able to get them on a flight and get them back home, and now we have them here. So, just glad to have them home." Mariam was thankful to be alive, as her kids gave her the drive to get back home, no matter what. "Thank you. I thank you again for everybody, you know, to help me and especially Cory, who is my hero," she said.

She also confirmed the State Department has called her three times since Friday, after she returned to the U.S. Rep. Jackson said they asked where she was in Afghanistan and did not seem to know she was back in the country.

Rep. Jackson also said the State Department has tried to take credit for the rescue. "She stayed strong and it was her determination. They got her family out of there. But also we want to thank Cory Mills," he said, also thanking his team and another company that helped.





Markwayne Mullin threatened US embassy staff in Tajikistan, outraged that they would not assist him in carrying a huge amount of money through the country as he attempted to travel to Afghanistan for an unauthorized evacuation effort, The Washington Post reported.

The Post reported that Mullin called the US embassy in Tajikistan on Monday, informing them that he would be flying from the country of Georgia to Tajikistan's capital of Dushanbe within hours and wanted help in transporting a large sum of cash, the Post reported. The Oklahoma congressman told the embassy that he planned to rescue five US citizens, a woman and her four children, from Afghanistan by hiring a helicopter, two US officials told the newspaper.

Embassy officials denied Mullin's request, saying they could not help him bypass Tajikistan's currency restrictions on his way to Afghanistan, the Post reported. Upset by the response he received, Mullin then threatened the top diplomat, Ambassador John Mark Pommersheim, and embassy staff, according to the Post.

As of late Tuesday, US officials told the Post that they were unsure of Mullin's whereabouts.

Mullin "has been and is currently completely safe," his spokeswoman, Meredith Blanford, said in a statement sent out Tuesday night, without elaborating on his current location. The incident was Mullin's second attempt to try and reach Afghanistan, the Post noted.

The Republican lawmaker had traveled to Greece last week and asked the Pentagon for permission to enter Kabul, but his request was denied, according to the Post.

Two other congressmen — Reps. Seth Moulton, a Democrat from Massachusetts, and Peter Meijer, a Republican from Michigan — made an unauthorized visit to Afghanistan last week as the US hurried to evacuate Americans and its allies, prompting sharp criticism from their colleagues.

My senior LES reached out to our MFA contacts asking for their assistance. It took us until about 17:00 to reach anybody due to the weekend. It was elevated quickly and we received word from the GoT that they would admit the family.



We first learned about this family last Monday when contacted by Congressman Markwayne Mullin. Embassy Dushanbe contacted her several times, and she informed us that she did not want our help. She would depend on Cory Mills (see contact information at bottom of attached e-mail). OCS (or TF) also contacted her to ask if she wanted Embassy Dushanbe consular assistance. She gave the same response.

When I talked to her today, she mentioned that she had already been at the border for 8 hours. At first I thought she meant that she had been traveling 8 hours. She also mentioned that she was waiting for Cory to come to the Taliban checkpoint to escort her across.







A Republican congressman from Oklahoma who tried to fly into Afghanistan defended his actions Friday in an interview with Fox News, saying he was trying to help stranded Americans and "wasn't trying to go over there and be a cowboy."

Mullin said he was approached in about making the trip by U.S. military veterans who wanted help getting an interpreter out, and eventually asked if he'd "sponsor" a flight out of the airport in Kabul. "That's the only way they could get in," Mullin said, so he agreed to make the trip. Baier reported that Mullin paid for the trip himself "with help from private contributions."

Mullin did not say where his flight departed from or when, but they were turned away while on approach to Kabul. "We circled the airport probably for an hour," he said. Mullin added he didn't know who turned the flight away "but I think it was 100 percent directed from the State Department."


